the book list or giving to caregivers or grandparents so they understand your parenting philosophy the parent handbook is printed in a convenient trade paperback format the flexible structure of the block plan preschool helps children learn all they need to know before entering public school but allows them to explore and learn at their own pace and according to their own interests best of all the lessons are fun for both parents and kids and helps the whole family play together parents are a child s most important teachers and the block plan preschool is an empowering resource to help them improve their child s early education reclaim the simplicity and freedom of childhood and enhance family relationships

abstract there is considerable evidence that young children in many developing countries suffer from profound deficits in nutrition health fine and gross motor skills cognitive development and socio emotional development early childhood development ecd outcomes are important markers of the welfare of children in addition the deleterious effects of poor outcomes in early childhood can be long lasting affecting school attainment employment wages criminality and measures of social integration of adults this paper considers the theoretical case to be made for investments in early childhood selectively reviews the literature on the impact of ecd programs in the united states discusses the evidence from latin america and the caribbean and makes suggestions for future research the focus is on the relation between outcomes in early childhood and measures of household socioeconomic status child health and parenting practices as well as on the impact of specific policies and programs the knowledge base on early childhood outcomes is still thin in latin america and the caribbean there are therefore very high returns to comparative descriptive analysis in the region as well as to careful evaluations of the impact of various programs world bank web site
